



Day 2-3 Nyungwe National Park

We're heading to Nyungwe National Park, the largest in Central and East Africa. The park is home to 13 primate species, including colobus monkeys, mangabeys, blue monkeys, and chimpanzees. With 310 bird species, it's also a popular destination for birdwatching. We'll track two chimpanzee groups, Cyamudongo or Uwinka, with each group consisting of around 80 individuals. As an optional activity, you can participate in a canopy walk, traversing steep valleys for an adventurous experience.

Day Volcanoes National Park

After breakfast, head to the Virunga Mountains, the habitat of the gorillas. It's approximately a 4 to 5-hour journey. Track one of the seven gorilla groups, and trekking can take between 1.5 to 8.5 hours. Once you encounter the gorilla group, you can spend one hour observing and enjoying the unique and moving experience.

Victoria Falls, located near the border with Zimbabwe, may be a country not widely known to the Japanese, but many might be familiar with this waterfall. The constant flow of water cascading into the gorge creates a truly spectacular sight.









North Luangwa National Park is recommended for walking safaris, while Lower Zambezi is ideal for a serene canoe safari. Kafue National Park, the second-largest in the world, is home to tree-climbing lions and rare endemic species. It's also a popular spot for birdwatching.
